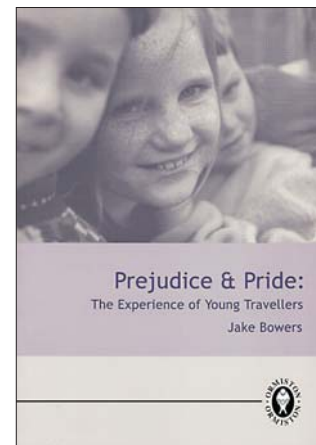
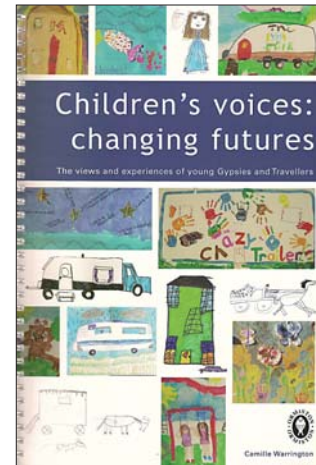

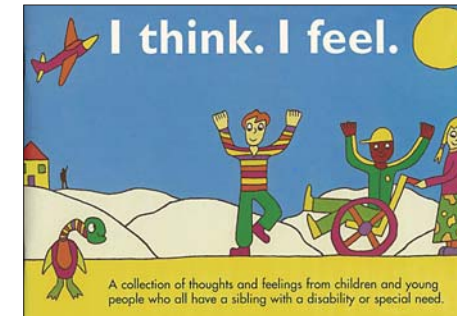
Prejudice and Pride

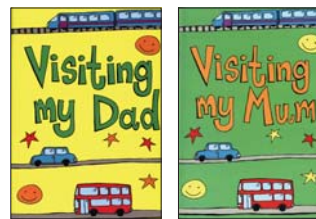
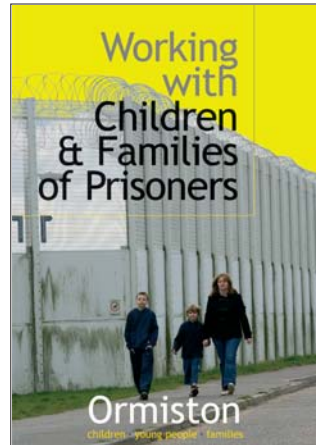

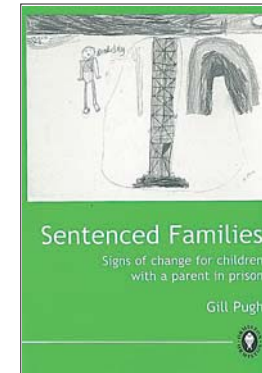

Time for Families: positive outcomes for children & families of offenders using Ormiston services in prisons and the community Gill Pugh 2006

This study measures the benefits of Ormiston's services to children and families of offenders, against the five key areas set out in *Every Child Matters*. The report's focus is on two support services - one delivered in the community and one in prison, both of which target the specific needs of children who have a parent in prison. The services provide early intervention, emotional and practical support to children and families, and special visits which enable children and their imprisoned parents to build and maintain a positive relationship. The report makes a case for sustaining and expanding these services, now well developed across the Eastern Region. It also contains a range of recommendations to other agencies.

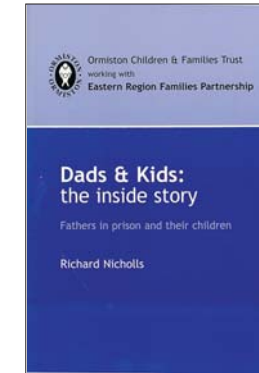
